## Attendance

We are pleased to say that our whole school attendance is maintaining a very good percentage.

Thank you for working hard to encourage your children to see how important their education is.

Here are some quotes from the DFES press release to show you how important it is that children attend school.

“Pupils missing up to just 14 days of school in key stage 2 (normally age 11) are a quarter less likely to achieve level 5 or above in reading, writing or maths tests than those with no absence.”

“Primary school pupils with no absence were around 1.5 times more likely to achieve the expected level (level 4 or above), and 4.5 times more likely to achieve above the expected level (level 5 or above), than pupils that missed 15 to 20% of key stage 2.”
