Special educational needs, often referred to as 'SEN' or 'SEND' (Special educational needs and disabilities), is a term used to describe learning difficulties or disabilities that make it harder for a child to learn compared to children of the same age. All children may experience challenges with their learning at some point and for most children, these difficulties overcome with support from teachers and home. However, children with SEND are likely to need extra or different help to be able to learn.

PAN-DISABILITY FOOTBALL GROUP LAUNCHED IN TELFORD

AFC Telford United Foundation has launched a pan-disability football group for players of all ages to develop their football and social skills. The group meets for training sessions and games every Sunday morning (11am) at the AFC Telford United Goalzone pitches in Wellington.

Club bosses are looking to create teams for players in the Under-12, Under-16 and senior age groups, with games against similar teams in the region. The aim is to give disabled players an opportunity to play football in a supportive environment, where participation and enjoyment of the game is most important.
